Today's Text

"Luke 11:14-54 shows the widening rift between Jesus and the Jewish religious leadership...This unit closes with Jesus' strongest rebuke of the Pharisees and scribes in this Gospel, which show just how off-course the Jewish leadership is." (Bock)

As Jesus confronts hypocritical religious leaders He levels three serious charges at them:

"You Have No Answer to Life's Big Problems" (11:14-28)

- \Rightarrow As we have seen so far in Luke, the ministry of Jesus was accompanied by many evidences of the <u>s</u>.
- \Rightarrow In 11:20 Jesus makes a subtle but intentional reference to the events of the first great <u>r</u> event in Scripture.
- \Rightarrow The main point of this section is not demonology, but C .
- ⇒ A warning to armchair quarterbacks: It's always easier to tell other people that they're doing it wrong when you're not doing it at all.

"You Have a Hard Heart" (11:29-36)

⇒ Sometimes (often!) a request for more proof is simply an evidence of an unwillingness to believe *no matter what!*

The BIG Problem with ReligionLuke 11:14-54 Pastor Jay Mosser

- ⇒ Jesus references the great revival that took place in the wicked Gentile city of Nineveh when Jonah preached there. The point? "Ungodly Gentiles responded to a spiritual challenge quicker than you do."
- ⇒ Cf. Luke 16:31

"You Love to Impress People with Externals"

(11:37-54)

This interchange was prompted by a moment of criticism about an external religious ceremony. Jesus issues three strong rebukes...

#1: "Your <u>h</u>	_ are clean l	out your <u>h</u>		are filthy."		
#2: "You're more	worried abo	ut <u>s</u>	than	·"		
#3: "You've made a life of faith impossibly hardYou've						
managed to	the	out of eve	erythin	g good that		
God created."						

Responding to God's Word
