•	Ideas always have \underline{c} . If there is no God and life developed by random chance, then right and wrong ARE \underline{m} terms, and human life has no true significance. But if God is real and we were made by Him and for Him, then right and wrong DO exist and our lives matter, both now and forever. Ideas DO have huge \underline{c} ! Last week we visited Daniel's world – a Jewish man living as an exile in ancient Babylon, a culture that is at odds with his faith. We see him interact \underline{w} AND be " \underline{o} of \underline{s} " with culture at precisely the same time.
Five Keys to Living for Christ in a Post-Christian World	
A.	 Speak the u Truth. I Kings 22. In Micaiah's day truth is s and people use r for personal advantage. T opinion.
B.	 Interact with culture wisely. Acts 17 & Acts 13. Paul does not just preach against c ; he preaches C . Paul is wise enough to address different cultures in different ways.
C.	 Use the law I Paul is a Jewish man and a follower of Christ. He is also a natural-born citizen of the Roman Empire with full rights under Roman law. How does he use those rights? Acts 22:22-29 (He uses the law to avoid a good b) Acts 25:9-12 (He a to a "higher court")
D.	Be g with unbelieving people. Paul knows that followers of Christ must live <i>in</i> the world, and that means rubbing shoulders with all kinds of people. Listen to his advice: • I Corinthians 5:9-13
Ε.	<u>Do not be silent</u> . Acts 18:9 "Silence in the face of evil is itself evil: God will not hold us guiltless. Not to speak is to
