## Getting Started

## Talking It Through

1. Review the sermon from Sunday: Re-read BOTH texts (Revelation 5 and Mark 16:1-8) and review the main sermon points from your notes. What was it about?
2. Review your notes about the importance of Easter to the Christian faith. Think about the comment, "If Jesus came merely to make us all feel better..." – what's the point of this, and do you agree with the sentiment? Also, according to I Corinthians 15, why is Easter so important?
3. The gospel accounts record how the ladies & the rest of the disciples reacted to the empty tomb & sightings of angels & reports of resurrection. How do their reactions support the truthfulness of the gospel accounts?
4. On Sunday we briefly reviewed the idea of Jesus as the "Lamb of God." Which text – or some other text that you know on that topic – do you appreciate the most, and why?

5. Reflect for a moment on the big worship scene in Revelation 5. What's the biggest worship crowd you've ever been in? How will this scene in heaven be **SO** different from anything you've ever experienced?

## Taking It Further & Taking It Home

God gave us the Bible to change us, not merely to inform us. THINK about how the resurrection of Jesus AND the great worship scene in Revelation should inform the way we live from day to day. How should our priorities be affected? How might our major life decisions be impacted? How about the things we obsess or worry about?
